

Tmux Cheat Sheet

Command	Explanation
<code>tmux</code>	Start new session
<code>tmux new -s name</code>	Start new session with name
<code>tmux ls</code>	List all the sessions
<code>tmux kill-session -t name</code>	Kill the mentioned session
<code>tmux kill-session -a</code>	Kill all sessions except the last used session
<code>tmux kill-server</code>	Kill all tmux sessions
<code>tmux attach -t name</code>	Attach/enter the mentioned session
<code>[Ctrl +b] + d</code>	Detach/exit the current session
<code>[Ctrl +b] + \$</code>	Name or rename current session
<code>[Ctrl +b] + c</code>	Create new window
<code>[Ctrl +b] + ,</code>	Name or rename current window
<code>[Ctrl +b] + w</code>	List all windows
<code>[Ctrl +b] + &</code>	Kill the current window
<code>[Ctrl +b] + n/p/N</code>	Move to next/previous/Nth window
<code>[Ctrl +b] + %</code>	Create horizontal pane
<code>[Ctrl +b] + "</code>	Create vertical pane
<code>[Ctrl +b] + space key</code>	Toggle the layout of current pane
<code>[Ctrl +b] + z</code>	Zoom into the current pane
<code>[Ctrl +b] + x</code>	Kill the current pane
